The following information is a summary of the State Appropriations for Iowa State University for FY2022.

Agriculture & Natural Resources Budget Bill – FY 2022

[HF 860](#) provides Iowa State University an increase of \$62,472 to the Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory operations to restore the FY 2021 cut. A new appropriation of \$150,000 is provided to ISU for the National Association of County Agricultural Agents (NACAA) conference scheduled to be held August 12-17, 2023 in Des Moines. The remaining budget line items are funded at status quo.

Economic Development Budget Bill – FY 2022

[HF 871](#) provides Iowa State University an increase of \$1,810,195 for the biosciences initiative. The remaining budget line items are funded at status quo.

Education Budget Bill – FY 2022

[HF 868](#) provides the Board of Regents universities with flat funding for FY 2022 and adds language that prohibits reducing money for universities' police departments in FY 2022. The bill also requests the legislative council to establish an interim study committee to examine the administrative costs, staffing levels, and allocation of staff at the Regents universities, as well as the graduation and student retention rates for each academic program. The study committee is to submit a report, including findings and recommendations, by December 15, 2021, for the 2022 legislative session.

Rebuild Iowa Infrastructure Budget Bill

[HF 862](#) provides the following:

- Funds the BOR Total Tuition Replacement at the requested level of \$28.1M
- Moves \$2M of the \$13,375,000 previously enacted FY 2022 appropriation for the ISU Student Innovation Center to FY 2023
- Maintains ISU's Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory appropriations of \$12.5M in FY 2022, \$12.5M in FY 2023 and \$16.1M in FY 2024
